Chairman's Report for the Town of Newton

As I reflect on the past year, I am thankful for all the cooperation I have received as chairman of Newton. I sincerely have appreciated the teamwork from the board and the people of our great Town. Because of this collaboration, the town has been able to meet each and every challenge and celebrate the achievements, some of which are listed below:

- Last year the Town board agreed to a change of insurance companies, saving over \$10,000.00.
- Fifty building permits were issued in 2018 amounting to \$6,108,362.00 worth of building and remodeling.
- The Town also welcomed Calumet Renewable Energy Company, located at the corner of South Union and Newton Road. We look forward to them opening this year and wish them the best.
- A number of road improvements were taken care of as well amounting to \$259,938.
 - Carstens Lake Road between Union and Hwy 42
 - Newton Road between Center and County Road U
 - Hecker Road south of Silver Creek Road
 - Scheffler Road crack filling and slag
 - Three culverts replaced on Gass Lake Road, Center Road and English Lake Road.
- The Town of Newton received a large amount of ground, and hauling services of the ground for free. Newton Road needed attention, and more specifically, the area near Willever Lane needed prompt attention. To begin the process of fixing Newton Road, the Town Board decided to use the fill to widen the area near Willever Lane first, because the shoulder was gone. The rest of Newton Road would eventually be fixed after this. An application for a permit from the DNR was acquired in order to follow all the DNR's requirements. The project began and so did the rain. Due to the heavy downfalls of rain for an extended period of time, it caused the wet ground to shift and as a result the culvert extension collapsed. The culvert was replaced, and some silt entered the creek and a nearby lake. The DNR was notified and the town worked with them to correct the problem. The town was issued a citation of \$641.50. The complete project amounted to \$22,572.59. The town was so grateful for the donation of the ground and hauling of the ground. Without this gracious gift, the cost would have been well over \$100,000.

A Big Thank you also to the following people:

- All of those people that put in their time working at the polls at election time.
- All the men who put in many hours removing snow to keep our roads safe last winter continuing into 2019 winter.
- Debra Behnke for keeping the Town Hall and Office cleaned.
- Last but not least a huge thank you to the Fire Department for their service along with the
 First Responders for the many hours put in serving our Town. Please keep both of these
 recognized departments in mind and consider joining the team in serving the community!

ZONING PERMIT FEES:

Our Zoning Administrator is Mike Slattery. Conditional Use, Variance and Zone Change Requests require an on-site inspection and a public hearing. The process takes several months. Allow yourself enough time. There is a charge.

BUILDING PERMIT FEES:

Our Building Inspector is Roger Mayer. The question is which signs require a permit and which ones do not. Signs in Business and Industrial Districts require a permit and must be approved by the Plan Commission. Each individual business is limited to a total of two signs. All signs, including all components, shall be set back a minimum of five feet from any property or right-of-way line. There is a sign permit fee.

The following do not require a sign permit:

- 1. Agricultural signs that pertain to the sale of farm products and not more than 32 square feet.
- 2. Real estate signs not more than 8 square feet.
- 3. Bulletin boards for public, charitable or religious institutions.
- 4. Memorial signs, tablets and names of buildings if cut into masonry surfaces.
- 5. Election signs with property owner permission.
- 6. Banners when authorized by the Plan Commission.

Flashing signs are not allowed and no sign shall contain moving letters or parts.

PLANNED RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT:

Pre-Application Meeting \$150.00 each

Any additional expense to be paid by applicant.

ADDITIONAL COSTS:

The applicant shall be responsible for reimbursing the town for engineering, inspection, legal and administrative costs incurred by the town.

Also permits are required for changes that affect the market value of your property:

- 1. A sanitary permit is required for charges that affect the market value of your property.
- 2. Setback of variance permits from Manitowoc County Planning and Parks Department are required on all new construction.
- 3. The Town of Newton requires building permits for all construction that is not considered minor repairs or general maintenance.

NO PERMIT REQUIRED:

A. Maintenance:

Repair walks.

Repairing gutters and down spouts.

Repairing porches and steps.

Repairing original siding.

Patching or repairing interior walls and ceilings

Exterior painting.

Replacing electrical Fixtures.

Replacing furnace.

Repair or replace weather stripping, screens, storm windows and doors.

Exterior landscaping.

Replacing existing shingles.

BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED:

B. Assessable Items:

New homes, garages, sheds, barns. Additions (any changes to the foot print of the building such as decks, ports, canopies.

Replacing older siding with aluminum or vinyl siding.

Substantial modernization of kitchens or baths.

Central air-conditioning.

Fireplaces

Extensive Remodeling

Recreation rooms or finished basement. Window replacement if size changes or the type of glass changes. (single pane to double, etc.)

Outdoor furnaces.

Outdoor deck - Attached or Detached

MOVING PERMITS

A moving permit is required for all buildings being moved on roads within the Town of Newton. The moving permit can be obtained from the zoning administrator. The sheriff's department should also be notified about such move.



WRECKING PERMITS

Any building being torn down, removed or burned by the Newton Fire Department should obtain a wrecking permit from the zoning administrator. There is no charge for this permit. Obtaining this permit insures that the building will be taken off of the tax roll.

ASSESSOR

Occasionally a town assessor may need to enter into land to update information to establish fair assessment value for each property. No entry into a building or dwelling will ever be made without consent. However, entry onto lands including lands around buildings is assumed unless a written notice is provided to our assessor to keep off your land. If an assessor is not allowed access for viewing property, an owner cannot contest at the Board of Review the assessment level set by the assessor (Sec. 70.47(7) (aa) of Wis. Stats.

DRIVEWAY AND CULVERT ORDINANCE

The Town Board has passed a Driveway and Culvert Ordinance. All residents in the town must have a permit for installing new driveways, new culverts or extending, replacing or repairing existing driveways or culverts. There is a \$50.00 fee for driveway or culvert permits. This permit may be obtained from the Road Superintendent, Dave Mueller, at the town shop. If you cannot get in touch with him leave a message on the answering machine at the shop. The telephone number is (920) 758-2338.

BURNING ORDINANCE

The Town of Newton has a Burning Ordinance. Violation of this ordinance can and will result in a fine. If found in violation, the first offense is a \$25.00 fine plus court costs; the second offense is a \$50.00 fine plus court costs; the third offense is a \$100.00 fine plus court costs; and the fourth offense is a \$200.00 plus court costs. Copies of the ordinance are available at the Recycling Center and the Newton Town Shop.

BURNING PERMITS

Burning Permits are required for all fires unless made in a barrel, trash can or other enclosed burner that has a heavy screen or cover to prevent burning material or embers from blowing out. Burning permits are available at Stock Mfg., Highway 42 Garage, Pine River Dairy, Recycling Center, Tom Hochkammer, Fire Chief, Nick Smith, Assistant Fire Chief or Dave Mueller, Road Superintendent at the Town Shop.

RECYCLING

A BIG THANK YOU! TO RAY, AL AND SCOTT FOR THE WORK THEY DO AT THE RECYCLING CENTER!! THEY ARE APPRECIATED!

Recycling guideline information is available at the Recycling Center. Due to Wisconsin State Law, a number of items previously accepted must now be refused. A comprehensive list is available at the Recycling Center with referrals for appropriate disposal. The attendant in charge has complete charge of the Recycling Center and the right to refuse any material not in compliance with Town, County and State recycling rules and regulations.

Paper and cardboard does not have to be separated. Paper, books and magazines must be bundled and bagged. Shredded paper must be enclosed in tied plastic bags or taped boxes. Boxes have to be flattened unless filled with paper or cardboard.

The blue container at the Recycling Center is not for garbage. It is clearly marked "Copper Only". When you are done emptying your glass or tin cans into the appropriate bins, then please bring the paper or plastic bag that contained those articles to the compactor for disposal. No bags or string allowed in plastic containers.

Please clean your glass, plastic and cans. Besides being one of the requirements for using the Newton Recycling Center, this will also help cut down on the bee problem during the warmer months.

POSTING BOARD.

Meetings are posted on the posting board outside of the Town Hall, Hi-Way 42 Garage, CR Stop as well at the Town of Newton web site which is: townofnewton.org.

DEPOSIT BOX

There is a deposit box located on the East side of the entrance to the Town Hall for payment of your first real estate tax installment and dog vaccination papers by January 31st. This box is locked and is secure. The second installment should be sent to the County Treasurer.

FIREWORKS PERMIT

The Town of Newton does have a Fireworks Ordinance in effect. Any fireworks that exceed the limits as set by Wisconsin Statute 167.10 must get a permit which can be obtained from the Town Chairman at the June Board Meeting.



DOG LICENSES

All dogs must be licensed and have their rabies inoculation by April 1 or you will be notified by the Law Enforcement Officer. Non-compliance will result in a \$35.00 late fee per owner. Contact Paulette Vogt, Treasurer, Phone (920)758-2720 for a license. Only authorized town officials are authorized to take animals to the Humane Society.

2018 marks the end of our 71st year of providing fire protection and prevention to the people and businesses of the Town of Newton. We constantly train and learn to provide you with the best fire protection services. In 2018, the Newton Fire Department responded to 54 calls which were the following in nature:

Vehicle accidents: 17 Fire Alarms: 5 CO Monitor Calls: 3 Structure fires: 8 Miscellaneous: 6 Public Service Calls: 6 Vehicle Fire Calls: 2 Cancelled calls: 7

10 of these calls were Mutual Aid Calls.

This past year, the Newton Firefighters, with the support of the community, invested \$17,400 into improvements to the Newton Firefighters Community Park. We put \$120,000 toward the purchase of the new equipment vehicle. Through our annual bowling tournament, we have raised and donated over \$150,000 to Children's Hospital of Wisconsin. We are very proud of being financially responsible and giving back to the community we serve.

Remember, you need to have a burning permit for any burning project not contained in a barrel or pit. Burning permits can be obtained from any of the fire chiefs, or during business hours at Hi-Way 42 Garage, Stock Manufacturing, Pine River Dairy, the Newton Town Shop, or the Newton Recycling Center.

If you have an emergency, call 9-1-1---and tell them what your emergency is, the address of the emergency, and the phone number you are calling from. It is your responsibility to keep your address sign clear of snow and brush so that the signs are easily readable. This allows us to quickly find you in an emergency. Be sure to change the batteries in your smoke alarm and carbon monoxide alarms yearly.

Newton First Responders have been providing this community with pre-hospital care for 31 years. We strive to provide the best pre-hospital care to those people we help. Remember, that anyone who needs pre-hospital care, emergency or non-emergency in nature, can access the services of the Newton First Responders; 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year; all at no cost to the patient. Behind the promise of good, quality care, is our commitment to maintain the high standards we have set for our organization. The members of the Newton First Responders have committed 505 hours of time for meetings, drills and schooling, and 415 hours of time on calls, for total of 920 hours this past year. Certified by the State of Wisconsin, the Newton First Responders provide the most up to date First Responder care and skills.

In 2018, the Newton First Responders responded to 136 calls. These calls included contact with 124 patients. 86 or 63% of these patients were transported to hospitals for further care. 72 calls or 52%, were medical calls for complaints of shortness of breath, chest pain, or other illnesses. 19 calls or 14%, were trauma related calls such as falls and 17 or 13%, were motor vehicle crashes. 8% of the patients received oxygen as part of their treatment. The UTV rescue vehicle was used at 6 events.

The Newton First Responders presently consist of 7 active members. 3 of these members are also members of the Newton Fire Department and 1 member are trained to Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) level or higher.

Applications are being accepted for additional members.

DIRECTIONS:

Remove pills from original container and put them in a sealed "ziplock" style bag that is quart size or smaller before placing in the drug drop box. Empty pill containers may be placed in your home recycling or trash. Liquid, powder, and cream medications should remain in original bottles with caps tightened.



DROP:

- Unused and/or expired medications
- · Over-the-counter medications
- Prescription medications
- Pet medications
- Controlled substances
- Supplements



DO NOT DROP:

- Sharps (needles, syringes, lancets etc.)
- Chemical waste/mercury products
- Electronic glucose monitors
- Non-medical inhalers
- Personal care products (shampoo, etc.)
- Pill bottles or boxes

- Never share your prescriptions with another person.

- If you cannot make the event then bring your unwanted medications to a Drug Drop Box located at the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Office, City of Manitowoc Police Department or City of Two Rivers Police Department. Make sure to follow these guidelines.
- Households only. Businesses should call 920-683-4333 for disposal information.

- Practice safe storage by keeping your medications in a secured location.
 Practice reduction by consulting with your physician about your medication needs.
 Never share your prescriptions with another person.
